"IN GOD WE TRUST"

On April 22, 1864 Congress passed legislation to authorize the minting of a two-cent coin. The Mint Director developed the design for the coin.

Secretary of the Treasury Salmon P. Chase wrote in a letter "the trust of our people in God should be declared on our national coins."



The motto IN GOD WE TRUST was placed on United States two-cent coins in 1864 largely because of the sentiment existing during the Civil War. The term has been used on our coins since 1864.

This year Republicans of River City will be using "IN GOD WE TRUST" as our Sacramento County Fair booth motto.

The MISSION TO OVERTURN CALIFORNIA PROPOSITION 209

The California Civil Rights Initiative (Prop 209), approved in November 1996, amended the California constitution to prohibit state government institutions from considering race, sex, or ethnicity, specifically in the areas of public employment, public contracting or public education. It was authored by Dr. Glynn Custred and Dr. Tom Wood and was the first electoral test of affirmative action policies in America. It was endorsed by Governor Pete Wilson and supported and funded by the California Civil Rights Initiative Campaign, led by Ward Connerly.

PROPOSITION 209

Democrat State Senator Edward Hernandez has been trying to overturn Prop 209. In his latest attempt all the Democrats in the state Senate voted in favor of his bill, SCA 5, to bring back discrimination to our public schools and all Republicans voted against his bill.

Under SCA 5 government can use race as a deciding factor in school placement. In one word discrimination.

Proposition 209 was modeled on the 1964 Civil Rights act that prohibited state government institutions from considering race, sex or ethnicity in the areas of public employment, public contracting or public education.

The Republican Party has always had strong views on civil rights and we fought very hard in the 50s and 60s to pass a voting rights bill and a civil rights act.

During the 1950s, Republican president, Dwight Eisenhower supported civil rights legislation but a Democrat controlled Congress at the time never sent him a bill he was able to sign as sweeping as either the 1964 Civil Rights Act or the Voting Rights Act.

Republican Leader Senator Everett Dirksen from Illinois and Republican Representative Charles (Mac) Mathias of Maryland and Republican Senator Jacob Javits of New York took leading positions in passage of both the Civil Rights and Voting Rights Acts of 1964

The Republican leaders of that era deserve credit for forging a consensus around the critical issues of voting and civil rights.

We believe that Senator Hernandez and other Democrats in the state legislature will try to bring a measure like SCA 5 back for a vote after the 2016 November election.

Perhaps a survey is in order? Survey a scientific sample of all non-Republican registrants to find out why they do not register as Republicans could tell us what the problem is and how to fix it.

A task the California Republican Party can, and should, do ASAP.

ANOTHER GIFT

John Goodman of the National Center for Policy Analysis in Dallas adds, "People are not going to be able to buy individual and family policies, and that's part of Obamacare. And what makes it so surprising is the whole point of Obamacare was to encourage people to get insurance, and now the market has been completely closed down for the next seven months."

There are a few exceptions but the reality is, tens of millions of people will be locked out of the health insurance market for the rest of this year.

The reason health insurance sales were restricted by congress to short enrollment periods was so insurance companies would have some certainty about who would be in the risk pool, allowing them to set their rates accordingly because, Goodman explains, "they fear that the only people who will try to buy are people who are sick, and they are going to be expensive. So it's built into the screwy logic of the whole Obamacare system."

Consumers can sign up, but under limited circumstances: "If you get married, divorced or fired from your job" says Goodman. Or you have a child, or lose a spouse or have a change in income. "It has to be one of those kinds of events. And if you don't

have that, you're not going to be able to buy insurance."

Unless there is one of these circumstances, millions of Americans will remain uninsured and won't be able to buy health insurance.



PROTECT YOURSELF FROM HEARTBLEED

A new security vulnerability, Heartbleed, means that people who use the Internet may have their passwords and other sensitive data stolen.

Do not log into accounts from afflicted sites until you're sure the company has fixed the problem.

One Web site that appeared to have been affected is Yahoo.

Once you've got confirmation that the security vulnerability is fixed, change passwords of sensitive accounts like banks and email first.. And keep your eye on financial statements for the next few days.

Comparing illegal immigration to a war that threatened the United States' future, GOP gubernatorial candidate Tim Donnelly once exhorted citizens to rise and join his fight to stop people from crossing the border, according to audio of a speech he gave in 2006.

Donnelly said in an interview Monday that he stood by his remarks. "Heck, I made the speech. Yeah, absolutely."

In the 2006 speech, Donnelly painted an alarming picture of illegal immigrants' effect on the United States. They have caused the destruction of schools, the bankruptcy of hospitals forced to provide them free medical care and led the government to abandon its citizens, he said,

asserting that the country was on the brink of a battle similar to the Civil War.
