

#### JIM BRULTE

Jim was elected to the Assembly in 1990 to represent San Bernardino County's 65th District and was re-elected from the 63rd District in 1992 and 1994. When term limits forced Jim out of the Assembly, voters elected him to the State Senate in 1996 with 58% of the vote. He was reelected in 2000 with 59% of the vote. Jim retired from the Senate in 2004 due to term limits. Jim was well liked by both his Republican and Democratic Colleagues and was a consensus builder who also never veered from his solid Republican principles.

Jim considered running for the State Board of Equalization in 2006; however, he decided not to run against Michelle Steel, the eventual victor. Jim stepped aside for the sake of G.O.P. unity - an unselfish move that was symbolic of his Republican principles.

Following disappointing results in California for Republicans in the 2010 and 2012 elections, Jim was widely encouraged to run for the chairmanship of the California Republican Party and was elected chairman on March 3, 2013.

- 10. Electrical Power Line Installers. Fatal Work Injury Ratio (Per 100,000): 19.5. Median Pay: \$49,000.
- 9. Taxi Drivers. Fatal Work Injury Ratio (Per 100,000): 19.7. Number Of Fatal Work Injuries: 64. Median Pay: \$23,000.
- 8. Truck drivers. Fatal Work Injury Ratio (Per 100,000): 25.4. Number Of Fatal Work Injuries: 774. Median Pay: \$38,000.
- 7. Farmers. Fatal Work Injury Ratio (Per 100,000): 26.1. Number Of Fatal Work Injuries: 268. Median Pay: \$61,000.
- 6. Structural Iron/Steel Workers. Fatal Work Injury Ratio (Per 100,000): 30.3. Number Of Fatal Work Injuries: 18. Median Pay: \$44,000.
- 5. Roofers. Fatal Work Injury Ratio (Per 100,000): 34.1. Number Of Fatal Work Injuries: 60. Median Pay: \$28,000.
- 4. Recycling Collectors. Fatal Work Injury Ratio (Per 100,000):

36.4. Number Of Fatal Work Injuries: 30.

Median Pay: \$22,000.

Median Pay: \$92,000.

3. Aircraft Pilots. Fatal Work Injury Ratio (Per 100,000): 56.1. Number Of Fatal Work Injuries: 71.

2. Logging Workers. Fatal Work Injury Ratio (Per 100,000): 104. Number Of Fatal Work Injuries:

Median Pay: \$33,000.

1. Fishers. Fatal Work Injury Ratio (Per 100,000): 127.3. Number Of Fatal Work Injuries: 42. Median Pay: \$26,000.

There were 3.5 fatal injuries per 100,000 for all full-time workers in 2011, according to the Bureau of Labor Statistics.

So the next time you slop some hot coffee on your hand while on break at work, consider the 10 occupations where a slipup could be the end.
